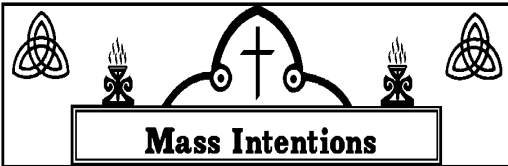

From Father's Desk.....

Economic Justice

I am intrigued by these recent protests which have been popping up in cities around the country in front of banks, corporate headquarters and federal regulatory agencies. Collectively they are being identified as the "Tea Party of the left" by some news people. This makes me a little uncomfortable in that I neither identify wholeheartedly with either the political "left" or the "right," but there are issues from both sides which resonate with my understanding of things rooted in faith.



In this case, there does, indeed, seem to be a growing disparity between the wealthiest of the nation and everyone else. When we see the stratospheric corporate earnings and salaries and consider these in the context of the recession, joblessness and a shrinking middle class, our blood begins to boil with the sense of injustice. But, what seems even worse to me is that corporate and investment culture seems to be a culture without allegiance to any nation or people. Granted, globalism seems like a natural evolutionary step for economic systems to take, but what about people, communities and societies? Sure, investors are "people" and many are great philanthropists; but the immense disparity between the 1% and the 99% remains . . . immense.

I am no left-leaning citizen, by any stretch; but I am hoping that these new protests shake up the system so that our up-coming generations will know the dignity of good and creative work. I take some inspiration for this reflection from Pope John Paul II, and I end with a quote as a source of principles for your reflection: . . . *among the actions and attitudes opposed to the will of God, the good of neighbor and the "structures" created by them, two are very typical: on the one hand, the all-consuming desire for profit, and on the other, the thirst for power, with the intention of imposing one's will upon others. In order to characterize better each of these attitudes, one can add the expression: "at any price." In other words, we are faced with the absolutizing of human attitudes with all its possible consequences. . . . The exercise of solidarity within each society is valid when its members recognize one another as persons. Those who are more influential, because they have a greater share of goods and common services should feel responsible for the weaker and be ready to share with them all they possess. Those who are weaker, for their part, in the same spirit of solidarity, should not adopt a purely passive attitude or one that is destructive of the social fabric, but, while claiming their legitimate rights, should do what they can for the good of all. The intermediate groups, in their turn, should not selfishly insist on their particular interests, but respect the interests of others . . . It is necessary to state once more the characteristic principle of Christian social doctrine: the goods of this world are originally meant for all. The right to private property is valid and necessary, but it does not nullify the value of this principle. Private property, in fact, is under a "social mortgage," which means that it has an intrinsically social function, based upon and justified precisely by the principle of the universal destination of goods.* (1987 Encyclical, *Sollicitudo Rei Socialis*, "The Social Concern")

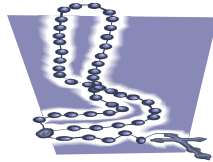

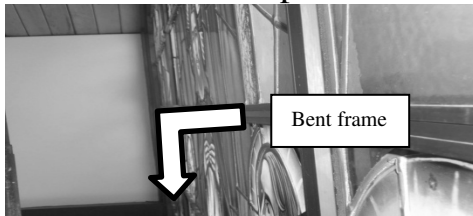

Window Update



I just received official word from the diocesan consultant on matters concerning buildings and structures, Deacon Tom Palanza. Concerning the last supper window, he wrote the following: *“It appears that the support frame was woefully undersized and installed in the field instead of being designed and fabricated by a reputable manufacturer. The weight of the stained glass has caused significant deflection in the frame to a critical point that will require immediate attention.”*

At this time I am awaiting a cost estimate from New England Stained Glass Company, and I will report this to you as soon as I am able.
