From Father's Desk.....

Of Preachers, Personalities & Emotional Neediness

A recent television news program had an investigative journalist inquiring into the ministry of a well-known televangelist. The minister had just purchased for himself a top-of-the-line corporate jet, for which an airstrip was built on the premises of his mansion. Apparently this would enable him to reach his wide-spread flock without the hassle of checking bags at the airport, or the indignities of the security check-in.

The report filed by the journalist was a familiar story of someone using the Christian Gospel to get rich. More impressive to me, however, were the clips of the preacher in action during one of his televised services. What an actor! I wondered to myself about the fine line between preaching the message and performance art. It is, I think, a fine line. On the one hand, it's important to try and keep people attentive and interested: Sometimes humor, colorful illustrations, or even some dramatic gestures are helpful. On the other hand, it seems to me that those of us who preach ought to be as "transparent" as possible to the Gospel and to Jesus as we can be. After all, it's not about me! It's not my "show."

Two things occur to me in light of my reflection on this matter: The first is to suggest that we all employ a critical eye when it comes to those who present themselves as preachers or prophets. We should ask ourselves, "Is the preacher performing as a function of his or her own ego, or as a servant of the Lord?" The other issue which emerges is that we need to be aware of our own emotional needs so that we don't become vulnerable to being duped or manipulated.

As for this latter point, I am keenly aware of the emotionally needy members of any congregation. What I mean by this is that there can be a tendency in some to overly "attach" themselves to a priest's personality . . . such that the message takes a back seat to the man. For some, this has to do with unfulfilled needs reaching back to childhood, or within a bad marriage (an absentee father, or emotionally distant spouse).

Whatever the case, I think that "awareness" is the key to this issue: I need to be aware of the "seductive power" of my role, and the temptations which can arise from my own ego. Here, the words of John the Baptist are always at the ready: "I must decrease, He must increase." And we all need to be aware of our own "emotional needs" and the ways we might be tempted to "fulfill" those needs which are unhealthy. Perspective is key here: Any priest, preacher or prophet is only as good as his or her ability to "magnify" the Lord, or open the way to his Gospel for people to draw near to Him.

Lest you read anything into these words, I have no "problem-relationships" in mind as I write these words. I was motivated by the content of the television report to reflect on this. You may think I'm dabbling too much in psychology; a discipline for which I am not qualified. However, I think the matter is crucial for a healthy and genuine faith. The "ego" or "pride form" can be a mighty adversary and an obstacle to true faith. How many have followed one particular priest around to wherever he moved? How many had their faith shaken to the core because of the moral failure of a priest or priests? These are some of the implications of the issue. Jesus touched upon this matter when he spoke of the scribes and Pharisees. He said, "[they] have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach, but they do not practice." (Mt. 23:1-3)
