From Father's Desk.....

Mass Distractions

I have been in this parish long enough for most active members to know that it isn't my style to scold people for any reason . . . especially those who are chronologically my elders. However, a few issues have accumulated which need to be addressed, and all of them fall under the double heading of **reverence & courtesy**:

1. I have heard complaints about **excessive talking and chatting in Church** . . . even by those coming to confession!

Don't get me wrong, I am not opposed to some "meeting and greeting" in Church. Neither am I opposed to people remaining to visit after a Mass is over.

The problem is to be found in the ongoing conversations in those moments before or during Mass, which are distracting to those wishing to spiritually prepare, either for Mass or Confession.

Please try to be aware of this issue and limit conversations to those brief "meetings & greetings," or in the post-Mass visits.



2. Gestures of reverence . . . missing in action.

We are all responsible for upholding a sense of the sacred at Church and, traditionally, part of this includes the gestures, postures and attitudes which correspond to being in Church. We are seeing folks forgoing the traditional gesture of "**genuflecting**" and/or bowing which support this communal sense that we are in a special place wherein the Lord becomes present.

For example, those who need to make a trip to the restroom ought to genuflect or bow toward the tabernacle & sanctuary. Consider that when you do this the distraction of your trip to the restroom is somewhat muted by your physical recognition of the sacred. Effectively, you will remind us to refocus our attention away from you, back to our prayer.



Please try to understand that, just as the Church building is designed purposely to evoke the sacred and remind us of the mysteries of God's presence within it, our gestures, appearance and attitude can either support or detract from the goals of worship, prayer and reflection in the minds and hearts of others.

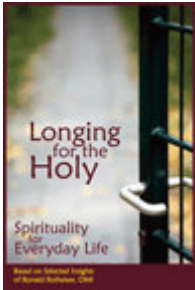
Pro-Life Reflection

This week is Natural Family Planning awareness week. What is Natural Family Planning? Natural Family Planning (NFP) is an umbrella term for certain methods used to achieve and avoid pregnancies. These methods are based on observation of the naturally occurring signs and symptoms of the fertile and infertile phases of a woman's menstrual cycle. Couples using NFP to avoid pregnancy abstain from intercourse and genital contact during the fertile phase of the woman's cycle. No drugs, devices, or surgical procedures are used to avoid pregnancy. NFP reflects the dignity of the human person within the context of marriage and family life, promotes openness to life, and recognizes the value of the child. By respecting the love-giving and life-giving natures of marriage, NFP can enrich the bond between husband and wife. (taken from <http://www.usccb.org/prolife/issues/nfp/information.shtml>).

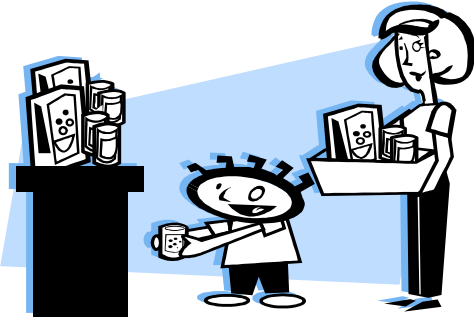
RCIA ~ The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults
