I want to name each and every person worthy of our thanks, but I am very much afraid of missing someone. I must, however, thank Mrs. Sue Moniz-Harrington for overseeing this immense project: She is a busy lawyer, wife and mother, and yet she was willing to add this complicated task to her life so that we could enjoy this great sign of life at our parish. Thank you to her, and all of you (you know who you are) who worked so hard to provide the meals, work the tables, organize attendees, and provide the labor for set-up and take-down. Thanks also to all who donated goods and materials for the event!

We enjoyed a beautiful day this past Sunday, and a fantastic supper on Saturday evening. The event was well attended, and much joy and music filled the air.

What does the future hold for this event?

While we celebrate an event which was well planned, executed and attended; concerns remain about sustainability when **the same, few people bear the brunt of the burden**. Faith-filled Adultswill resume the series on *Catholic Spirituality* next week..

Greetings!

For the past 2 years we have been running the Life Teen Annual Campaign and I wanted to share with you what's happening in our youth ministry program.

We have completed the last phase of transiting our middle school faith formation program to the Edge program. Edge, just as Life Teen, encompasses 3 areas of the spiritual journey of our youth: Catechesis, Service and Community.

Enrollment in the Edge and Life Teen programs has increased over the last couple of years. This past year we had almost 60 middle-schoolers in each grade, almost 70 Teens received Confirmation this past May and around 40 sophomores, juniors and seniors continue to participate in the program after receiving their confirmation. In comparison to the enrollment of our surrounding parishes, we have an average of 25 more youth in each grade!

From May of last year to April of this year, our high school youth clocked over 2,240 hours of community service and 7 of them traveled with me to Puerto Rico for a mission trip. While we were there we got to experience God's love by serving those who are far less fortunate than we are.

In addition to the countless hours of service our teens provided to our parish and community, 10 of them have become Lectors, 15 have become Eucharistic Ministers and 35 have become Peer Ministers who help as mentors to our middle and high school program. It is because of their openness and willingness to serve God that I can say proudly and with confidence that we have a spiritual and successful youth ministry program for our middle and high school youth.

For the next couple of weeks, you'll find a donation form in the bulletin. The monies that we raise in this year's annual campaign, as in years past, will go directly to the Teens by providing opportunities for them to grow and deepen their faith. Money is not what sustains our program, it's your prayers. So if a financial contribution is not possible, then please continue to pray for me, our core team of adult volunteers and especially our youth. I offer my thanks and praise to God for the opportunity to serve you and the youth of this parish and I am blessed to be a member of this amazing community here at St. Julie's.
