From Father's Desk.....

Paying the Necessary Price

Money, Money, Money! I try my best not to be one of those pastors who are always talking about it and asking for it; but, inadvertently, I often seem to be in this position. Someone or some group is always selling something at the door or in the bulletin which I am asked to promote from the pulpit at the end of Mass. Of course, these are all things done for the benefit of the parish and her mission. But, purchases of Malassadas, or tickets for Pancake Breakfasts or Seafood suppers fall outside of the realm of, what can be called, "intentional giving." What does that mean?

I would define it in terms of a giving which is truly in touch with the needs and the mission of the parish in this early part of the 21st century. Consider the fact that when Church's and Catholic schools were run exclusively by priests and religious the payroll of such institutions were laughably low. The sisters got something between a pittance and nada! And, back in the day---while some pastors may have been "fat cats," most of the priests under them couldn't afford a car. And, mind you, this was the age when the Churches were packed with people . . . each giving their one or two dollars, (which all added up quite nicely).

Fast forward to today, and we have a radically different situation: It costs a bundle to send kids to Catholic school, because the labor isn't free anymore. Lay teachers deserve and require a just wage for their work. Similarly, if our parishes are going to be able to meet the urgent demands of the modern situation, we are going to need to sustain staffing which is adequate to the task. Currently in this parish we are really trying to address the needs of the youth through our catechetical and youth ministry program, (this requires a skilled Youth Minister and Coordinator of Religious Education). We are also trying to chip away at the problems of poor formation of our Adults through Adult Faith Formation, (which requires a director). Add to these ministerial functions the staff necessary to maintain the office and the plant, and you have a hefty payroll.

I realize that most everyone feels "nickel and dimed to death." **The point of this reflection is not to specify how much or what percentage people need to give or "should" give: However, it is to suggest that giving ought to be thoughtful and intentional . . . based on what the Church is today, and not as it was in the past.** After all, we are trying to provide for a Church that will be here for our children, and their children and their children's children! It is our commission to hand down this faith . . . faith in Him who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Greetings!

For the past 2 years we have been running the Life Teen Annual Campaign and I wanted to share with you what's happening in our youth ministry program.

We have completed the last phase of transiting our middle school faith formation program to the Edge program. Edge, just as Life Teen, encompasses 3 areas of the spiritual journey of our youth: Catechesis, Service and Community.

Enrollment in the Edge and Life Teen programs has increased over the last couple of years. This past year we had almost 60 middle-schoolers in each grade, almost 70 Teens received Confirmation this past May and around 40 sophomores, juniors and seniors continue to participate in the program after receiving their confirmation. In comparison to the enrollment of our surrounding parishes, we have an average of 25 more youth in each grade!

From May of last year to April of this year, our high school youth clocked over 2,240 hours of community service and 7 of them traveled with me to Puerto Rico for a mission trip. While we were there we got to experience God's love by serving those who are far less fortunate than we are.

In addition to the countless hours of service our teens provided to our parish and community, 10 of them have become Lectors, 15 have become Eucharistic Ministers and 35 have become Peer Ministers who help as mentors to our middle and high school program. It is because of their openness and willingness to serve God that I can say proudly and with confidence that we have a spiritual and successful youth ministry program for our middle and high school youth.

For the next couple of weeks, you'll find a donation form in the bulletin. The monies that we raise in this year's annual campaign, as in years past, will go directly to the Teens by providing opportunities for them to grow and deepen their faith. Money is not what sustains our program, it's your prayers. So if a financial contribution is not possible, then please continue to pray for me, our core team of adult volunteers and especially our youth. I offer my thanks and praise to God for the opportunity to serve you and the youth of this parish and I am blessed to be a member of this amazing community here at St. Julie's.
