From Father's Desk.....

*Anti-Catholic Whopper(s)*

I'm going to name names in this article!

The Lighthouse Bookstore in the plaza across from Bishop Stang High School is no friend of our Faith. Numerous people have gone there looking for devotionals, rosaries, and catechisms, only to have their Faith assailed by the anti-Catholic staff who work there. I am sure that those staff people think that they are "saving" their patrons from, what is in their minds, something false or evil; but, in reality, they are perpetuating historical caricatures of Catholicism, or biblical interpretations which are part of the earliest reactions of the Protestant Reformation. The following is a sampling of what you might encounter from such people:

*The Catholic belief in the Eucharist is not based on Scripture. Jesus did not literally mean the bread and wine was his body and blood any more than he meant he was literally a "vine" and we "branches."*

**We reply:** From Apostolic times, the Church has held that Christ becomes truly present in the Sacraments and in the Eucharist in particular. His physical presence in the world is perpetuated by these mysteries. In the Acts of the Apostles, (2:42) it describes the worship of the Church as "the teaching of the Apostles, communal life, the breaking of the bread, and prayers." The same phrase "the breaking of the bread" is found in St. Luke's account of the disciples on the Road to Emmaus: there we are told that the Lord taught them the meaning of the scriptures (yet they didn't recognize him); then he "broke the bread" and "their eyes were opened" and they saw that it was Jesus, (Luke 24:35). It was like our own liturgy in miniature! The last supper accounts of Matthew, Mark and Luke all record Jesus identifying his body and blood with the bread and wine of the Passover meal! He doesn't say "this represents my body/blood," but "this IS my body/blood." The real kicker comes in John 6: 51ff wherein Jesus speaks of his "flesh" as "real food" and his blood as "real drink." He tells us "if you do not "eat my flesh and drink my blood" you will not have life in you. The word "eat" is purposely changed from the beginning of that chapter from a sense of dainty "dining" to animal like "chewing/gnawing". Hence, there is a qualitative difference between the analogy of the vine, and the teaching on the Eucharist. All of this biblical evidence supports the Church's faith in the real presence of Jesus; a physical presence which began in this world at the first Christmas, and is perpetuated in the Eucharist and other Sacraments of the Church. Jesus is the new "manna" in our desert, as we journey to the Promised Land.

Unfortunately, I only had room for one "whopper," but there are many others . . . claims we worship Mary, Saints and Statues . . . claims of pagan origins of our Faith . . . claims against the Pope . . . etc. The message: Be careful where you shop, and be armed with good knowledge of the Faith. Look for pamphlets available in our pamphlet racks, and read the Catechism along with good books on "Catholic Apologetics," (literature defending and explaining the faith)

### **Faith-filled Adults**

As you probably know from the bulletin and from Mass announcements our parish book groups began reading Henri Nouwen's *Life of the Beloved* last week. The premise of the book arises from the narrative found within the pages of its prologue. This narrative reveals that the motivation for this book comes at the bequest of a young reporter who met Nouwen while interviewing him for a newspaper article. A friendship grew and on one occasion the young man, "a Jew, living in the secular world of New York City," asked Nouwen to write something for him and his friends about the spiritual life. Nouwen took up the challenge which resulted in *Life of the Beloved*.

Nouwen searched for a single word, a single message for his friend. That word is *Beloved*. He wants his readers, indeed all people, to know that the words spoken to Jesus at the time of his baptism, "'You are my Beloved,' reveal the most intimate truth about all human beings." He calls our Belovedness a great gift. He counsels the reader that obstacles exist to knowing that God calls does in fact whisper to each person, "You are my Beloved, on you my favor rests." These obstacles, he writes, are those things that tempt us toward the trap of self-rejection. Reading further we encounter the great spiritual wisdom of the author, "Every time you listen with great attentiveness to the voice that calls you the Beloved, you will discover within yourself a desire to hear that voice longer and more deeply.

So this week, let us make it our prayer, for ourselves and for each other, that each of us will listen to, as well as help each other listen to, God's whisper within our hearts saying " (insert your name here) , you are my Beloved."
